HPUD OPERATIONS AND ADMINISTRATION


Employee Meeting

I am organizing an employee meeting to go over insurance information, have a safety presentation, and update on HPUD programs and projects. We are trying to schedule the room so we can confirm the date of the meeting. It will be held in the afternoon from 12:30 to 2:30pm.

TTHM Information

The chart below provides a chart of our TTHM monthly test results. As you can see our most recent test in August was an anomaly. We retested, but we don't have the test results available at this time. We anticipate they will not be as low as indicated at McCabe. The State will average

the two results for our reporting requirements. These results are from our test locations the furthest from the plant and which are the State approved test locations.



Special Districts Joining LAFCo

I met with Antonio Ortega from the IID. He and I are going to start talking with City Managers about the possibility of Special Districts having a seat on the LAFCO Board. The next step in our efforts to secure Special Districts a seat on LAFCO Board is to attend the City County Managers meeting, which is held monthly. I will attend along with a representative from IID to encourage City/County Managers to talk with their Boards about the alternative cost proposal should Special Districts vote to join LAFCO. I will keep you posted, but the next meet will most likely be in October.

Harassment Prevention Training Requirement

You are all signed up to take the free online Harassment Prevention Training provided by CSDA through our insurance carriers SDRMA. If you have any trouble accessing the training or getting your certificate, please let me know. Once you get the certificate, please forward it to me or Raquel for our files.

Ware Road Water Break Repairs

Staff was unable to repair the first water break on Ware Road and still maintain a safe distance between the HPUD water line and the IID cement underground canal. We made some modifications to the installation and are going up and around the IID canal to ensure that the lines have separation and won't contact.

Redevelopment Agency Oversight Board

I attended the first RDA Oversight Board meeting. I was selected to serve on the RDA Oversight Board by the County Board of Supervisors after attending a LAFCO meeting on behalf of the HPUD. The Board voted that I serve as the Chairman and Ray Castillo, County Board of Supervisors, is Vice-Chairman. The Board will meet about once a month.

Community Center Facility

I received a phone call from the County Public Works regarding some possible new facilities at the County Community Center. They are going to remove the boxing ring and are discussing the possibility of installing a splash pad. They asked if HPUD would be able to take and process water samples. I told them that HPUD does not have a lab and we don't process our water quality tests, but we do send them to the County environmental health department.

County Community Information Meeting

I attended the Community Information Meeting held by the County of Imperial. They discussed the upcoming street projects, the completed income survey, and the new sidewalks and bus shelter project. I have attached some information from that meeting.

HPUD PROJECTS

Jiggs Johnson Solar Light Project

We hope to award the purchase of the solar lights for Jiggs Johnson Park at the meeting on September 20th. HPUD staff will install the lights according to the design provided by the light manufacturing company.


Heber Recreation Room (IID Funded)

We have submitted a conceptual design to the County Planning department. We hope to get their approval on a waiver of the 25' rear setback requirement. Additionally, we are asking them about the required number of parking spaces needed at the building. If we get this waiver and know the number of parking spaces needed, we will be able to determine the size of the building we can purchase. As soon as we determine the size, we will submit the RFP. I have not asked for a tour of the El Centro School building, but will do that this week.

Recently, I was informed that IID Director Salas may have some discretionary funds available from the Local Entity. I am going to request a meeting with her to see if she will commit additional funding to our Recreation Room project.

This letter is to formally acknowledge the dedicated efforts of the Heber Public Utility District's Governing Body, management and staff towards proactive risk management and loss prevention training. Your agency's efforts have resulted in no "paid" property/liability claims for program year 2017-18. A "paid" claim for the purposes of this recognition represents the first payment on an open claim during the prior program year and excludes property claims. This is a great accomplishment!

It is through the efforts of members such as Heber Public Utility District that SDRMA has been able to continue providing affordable property/liability coverage to over 505 public agencies throughout California. In fact, 428 members or 85% in the property/liability program had no "paid" claims in program year 2017-18.

In addition to this annual recognition, members with no "paid" claims during 2017-18 earned 2 credit incentive points (CIPs) thereby reducing their annual contribution amount. Also, members with no "paid" claims for at least 3 consecutive program years may receive a lower "risk factor" which also reduces their annual contribution amount.

As SDRMA is dedicated to serving its members and preventing claims, we would appreciate your agency taking a moment and sharing with us what made your District successful in preventing property/liability losses. Our goal is to incorporate your successful ideas and suggestions into our loss prevention programs to benefit all members of SDRMA. 



Also, members without claims receive a lower "experience modification factor" (EMOD) which also reduces their annual contribution amount.








Eligible Area/Área Elegible

- A total of **604** parcels were identified in Heber (Vacant lots, vacant housing units, vacation housing units, and commercial properties).
- HCD & HUD suggest that at least **300** responses are acceptable for the Heber community (HCD CDBG Appendix N, p. N-9).
- **345** total responses were obtained via mail & in-person (71 by mail & 274 in person).






2017-2018 Imperial County Road Funds
