The Holt Group, Inc. prepared a number of grant applications from various agencies during the past year. The following is a status summary of each of those grants.

Status:

All grant applications have been approved by the APCD and have been submitted to the California Air Resources Board (CARB) for review. Upon approval by CARB, contracts will be forwarded to HPUD for review and execution. The Imperial County Board of Supervisors will also need to approve the contract. CARB is expected to conduct their public meeting on APCD's recommendations in November or December 2021. Based on previous program years, CARB has approved all recommendations made by Imperial County APCD.

Status:

USDA approved all three applications. A letter of conditions was forwarded to HPUD. The Grant Program is based on reimbursement and HPUD may now begin to purchase equipment and begin bidding on the construction projects. All funds must be expended within one year.

Status:

A field visit was conducted by the State Parks and Recreation on July 2, 2021. SPP Applications are still under review by the Department of Parks and Recreation. Decisions and notifications are anticipated to go underway starting in late fall or early winter.

Alley Behind Children's Park

HPUD initiated a request with the County of Imperial to abandon the alley adjacent to Children's Park in the hopes of extending the park grounds and establishing a paved walking trail. The request was initiated in November 2020. The County responded on January 13, 2021 stating the need to address issues related to residential access, emergency vehicle access, and utility easements. The County stated that they will be bringing forth an action to the County Board of Supervisors but no action has taken place to date. Ms. Fischer followed up on April 8, 2021 with Tony Rouhoutas. The County wanted to set up a meeting between HPUD and County staff, but no meeting has occurred. The Holt Group followed up again on September 9, 2021. The County is supportive of abandoning the alley but no action has taken place.
